

Recreation Opportunity Guide

HIKING -- HOLLAND FALLS NRT #415

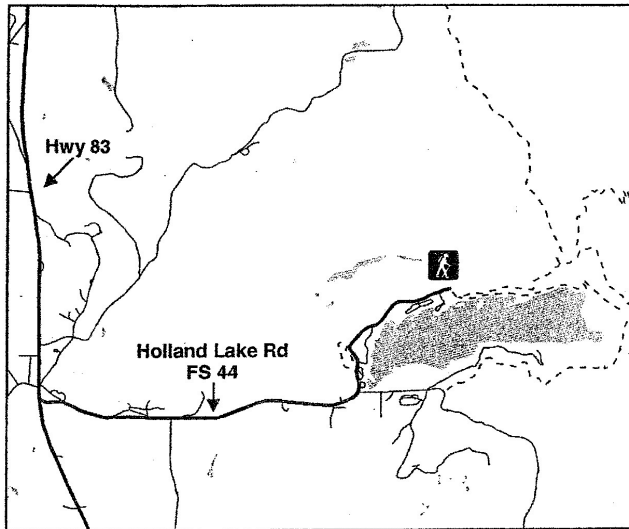
DESCRIPTION: The trail takes off at the trailhead on the end of Forest Road #44, which is on the north side of Holland Lake. This is a hiker only trail, excluding stock, motorized vehicles, and mountain bikes. Most users are from the Holland Lake Lodge or nearby Forest Service campground.

ACCESS: From Seeley Lake on Highway 83, approximately 20 miles to Holland Lake Road #44 (MP 35). Road is suitable for all types of vehicles. Turn right, four miles to end of road. Trailhead beyond Holland Lake day use area, campground and Lodge.

ROUTE: Route follows lakeshore, then climbs up a talus slope a total of 750' elevation at a moderate gradient 1.6 miles to the falls. Much of the route is on an exposed south slope which provides nice views, but can be hot during summer months. Carry water. Elevation at the trailhead is 4,050 and 4,800 at the end.

ATTRACTION: Scenic hike overlooking Holland Lake with background view of Mission Mountains and close views of Swan Range. Holland Lake is a 40-foot waterfall. Upper Holland Lake lies farther towards Gordon Pass for the more adventuresome. The trail has been designated as a "National Recreation Trail."

SEASON: Trail is available yearlong, usually snow covered late November thru mid April.
