Backroad Byway Sightseeing

Seeley Lake Montana is surrounded by hundreds of miles of gravel forest roads available as driving for pleasure opportunities. The roads were constructed to accommodate logging trucks and are suitable for most passenger vehicles. Many of them are closed to motor vehicles (making excellent hiking and biking routes) for resource protection purposes.

The following few are open during the snow-free season for sightseeing. They offer a good way to spend a day appreciating our natural resources. A Lolo National Forest map is recommended to give better detail. Roads are not well marked allowing a sense of self-discovery and some navigational challenge.

DRIVE SAFELY!

Remember two cardinal rules for driving forest roads: 1)
Drive at a speed so you can stop in less than half the sight distance, and 2) keep to the right side of the road on blind curves.
